We're working closely with the AMA, ABATE of Ohio, the Confederation of Clubs, Columbus Coalition of Clubs and T.R.A.I.N. MRO on this piece of legislation, and the in-roads we're making are already paying off dividends.

When it became known recently that the legislature was trying to abscond with \$750,000 from our Rider Education Fund, the AMA alerted all the Ohio rights organizations, and once again we all sprang into action and succeeded in getting them to look elsewhere for their funding, leaving our rider training money alone.

I'm sure all of our CMRO Regions are busy planning their riding schedule and putting together regional events. One new program that I'm excited about is to give a "Ride Pass" to each region's officers which will allow them to go to other region's events for free. This should help gain participation from other regions, and help us to work together and get to know one another better.

So keep an eye out for these Run Passes, and welcome each other's officers to our events and rides...and it wouldn't hurt to tell 'em "Thank You" for all their of hard work on behalf of Ohio's motorcycle community. After all, if WE don't do it, NO ONE will!

REGIONAL LEGISLATIVE OFFICER

REGARDING INSURANCE

It's only May and look at what all's happening and coming up. We've had the helmet law threat introduced and then removed by Ohio's legislature. We've had proponent testimony offered regarding the Right of Way Violations bill. We've fought back efforts to rob the State's motorcycle safety funds by the control board. Yes, it's been a busy winter and spring.

We've seen the State CMRO conference come and go in Medina. They really had some good sessions on membership, effective flyer preparation, communications and promoting CMRO. It was good to see all of the attendees from the other regions and Region 15/16 did itself proud with some good attendance during the day sessions and even better during the evening. All good stuff and most of it pretty interesting. Thanx to Kenny G. for spinning the tunes during the evening social session.

Thanks to those who worked so hard to sign up new members at our spring runs. The organization really does sell itself if we only talk it up. Below are several of the Ohio bills that we're watching and weighing in on when it's appropriate:

HB 56 Allows the use of photo traffic law monitors only if an officer is present.

HB 146 Regarding seizure of motorcycles by law enforcement.

HB 388 Regarding violation of assured clear distance
SB 158 Increase penalties - assured clear distance / right of way

Two federal bills in congress that matter to us:

HIPAA HR 2792/S 577 Close the insurance loopholes that allow companies to deny coverage for injuries sustained in a motorcycle accident

HR 2048 Right to Repair Bill which prevents manufacturers from using propriety systems that only they can use to diagnose and/or repair a vehicle.

You can see that there's still (always) lots to be done. I urge you to contact your state and federal elected officials to weigh in on these. I'd also urge you to talk these up to your friends to demonstrate just how important MROs and especially CMRO are.

I would like to share with everyone some things that I learned at the Back to Basics seminar. We all know that insurance is very important, but just making sure that you get coverage on your bike every spring is not enough. There are a lot of little thing to check on. One thing is to make sure that you have full coverage. If you are in an accident, you may get only blue book value for your bike. Be certain that your bike accessories and all of your gear will be covered as well- clothes, glasses, helmet, etc.

Another thing to watch for is if you have guest/passenger liability- does it cover your spouse or passenger? Insurance may cover passengers but not ones that are in your family. Do not count on medical/health insurance to cover you or your spouse in the event of a motorcycle accident, either, as some policies have loopholes for motorcyclists where they don't have to cover them.

If you are still paying on your bike, look into gap insurance. It bridges the gap between what the bike is worth, and what you still owe on it. That way, if it is totaled, you won't have to pay anything out of pocket to pay off the rest of the bike. Also, for a minimal amount, you can have your insurance so that if you are hit by an uninsured or underinsured driver, your insurance will make up the difference between their policy and yours. You may also want to check if you are covered for towing.

Finally, buyer beware of policy limits and exclusions.

Motorcycle Health Insurance Discrimination:

If you, or someone that you know, was denied health-care payments due to a motorcycle-related injury: Peter Nonis (AMA Senior Legislative Assistant) is interested in cases that fall outside the employer-provided health care plans, meaning those cases affecting the self-insured.

Currently, U.S. law states that while an employer cannot exclude you from health care coverage, they can deny you medical reimbursement payments due to the fact that the injury *happened* on a motorcycle. The purpose of the legislation we support is to end this discrimination and allow riders to get the medical payments necessary to them under then-given medical plans. Any information you relay to AMA will be kept in confidence and not used for dissemination purposes.

THE WARREN REPORT

WHO SAID “THEY NEVER LISTEN?”

On April 14th, we received information from the AMA that the Ohio Office of Budget & Management planned to request that the Ohio Controlling Board approve its proposed transfer up to \$750,000 from the Motorcycle Safety & Education Fund as soon as April 24th. With little time to mount a campaign, we launched our **EMAIL ALERT SYSTEM** and requested that our membership contact the 6 members of the Control Board to express their opposition to such an action. The AMA and ABATE, Inc. did likewise.

Apparently the sleeping giant (motorcycle riding community) paid heed to the call and responded with thunder. One member of the Control Board stated he was receiving 4-6 hundred responses per day. In the end, at its Hearing on the 24th, the Controlling Board decided against authorizing the use of the Mc. Safety & Education Funds and looked elsewhere to fill the gap in the budget.

We only had 5 business days to convince the 6 member Controlling Board, consisting of 3 State Senators and 3 State Representatives, to pull the plug on the proposed transfer and because of the response by the motorcycle riding community, the campaign was successful. Our thanks goes out to all of you that responded.

We must not relax our guard, however, and become complacent because of our recent “victories”. Government is the business of making laws and doing what it thinks is in our best interest. There’s always some negative issue just over the horizon that will one day hit our radar screen. As Thomas Jefferson warned 2 centuries ago, “The price of liberty is eternal vigilance!” Will you be ready?

Just a word of caution. There was a small problem in this past email campaign, however. We were informed that it appears someone or more may have used their address book to send multiple copies of letters to the Board members. We were informed that quite often, legislators call the senders to personally discuss the matter at hand. It seems there were a number of people who, when contacted, stated they did not send the email. Too much of this will ruin a fast, economical and efficient communication method. At this point, we don’t know who or even how many were sent in this fashion. While we’re reasonably sure it was not meant to harm the campaign, we ask that anyone so inclined to employ this tactic refrain from doing so in the future. Enough said.

Ohio Controlling Board Approves Additional Appropriation for Motorcycle Ohio

The Ohio Controlling Board (OCB) this afternoon approved an appropriation request for \$600,000 submitted by the Ohio Department of Public Safety on behalf of Motorcycle Ohio. You’ll recall that last month the OCB rejected a request for transfer of \$750,000 from the Motorcycle Safety and Education Fund for other purposes.

This \$600,000 additional appropriation for fiscal year 2007 (July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007) will help Motorcycle Ohio provide additional training classes, sponsor sites, and purchase replacement motorcycles for its aging fleet.

The motorcycling community, members of the OCB, and many state representatives and senators have clearly demonstrated their support for motorcycle safety and awareness in Ohio. Let’s continue to support Motorcycle Ohio’s efforts by monitoring its training and awareness activities to ensure all Ohioans have access to its life-saving programs.

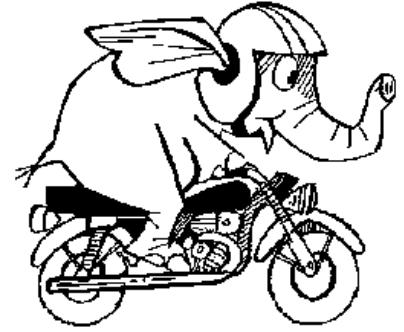
